- Pray that funding applications recently submitted for a variety of programmes are successful and that funding partners continue to see the value and impact of Romsey Mill's work.
- Pray for Family Workers within the Children's Centres as they strive to support families through difficult times—pray they have compassion, wisdom and understanding.

- Young people will be preparing to move from primary school to secondary school soon. Pray that they feel confident about this transition and can look forward to the next phase in their lives.
- Some young people with autistic spectrum conditions struggle with the lack of routine over the summer holidays. Pray that they are able to relax, enjoy themselves and access Aspire's summer programme.

- Many of the families we work with can't afford holidays away from home and this can be a source of great sadness. Pray that they know that being together and having fun is enough to build happy memories for their children.
